Welcome back!! I am certain everyone is ready to begin another great year. It should be an exciting one as we have many new things in store for the orchestra.

As you may know, we now have our own room in the Freshman Center. This will be a very positive change for students. We have some new equipment and new storage facilities. Even though many things are still not in place, we can work together to make the new room our home.

Thanks go out to Ann Pagano, Susan Deeg, Carol and Jim Budzynski, Ann Malarky and Ellie Clapp for all their help. Of course I cannot forget the student helpers Sam Clapp, Cormack Miller, Joe Mynhier, Stephen and William Fuqua, Nicole Budzynski, and Nora and Katie Deeg as well as Deegettes Carl and Lilly!! Hope I didn't forget anyone! I really appreciate all the help in making this move.

The year will get off and running right away as the orchestras will be performing in the Fall Festival at Lions Park on Sept. 10. The middle school orchestra will play beginning at 3:15 and the high school orchestras will perform at 3:45 p.m. The performance will conclude with the Community Orchestra. Hope to see all of you there!

Another big event will be the planning of our March trip to Vienna. Students and parents can still sign-up to go on the trip and more information will be sent home the first week of school. So far, we have a nice ratio of parents to students but we will be monitoring the chaperone number carefully. If parents are interested in going as chaperones, please let me know.

As we prepare for the trip we have had and will continue to have fund raising opportunities. Last year students were able to sell ISO tickets, sign-up for working the concession stand, working at the garage sale, butterbraids and cheesecake sales, market day workers, and also the ongoing bracelet sale. Students can still sell bracelets and there are many great opportunities for selling coming up. Notes from the Band Director

Welcome to all the new band students and parents, and welcome back for all the returning band students and parents. It has been a great summer for my family. My 16 month old, Whitney, is walking so well I call her the "Nomad", and our 3 year old, Morgan, is almost completely out of diapers! It has also been a good summer for the band. The jazz band performed in Lion's park and the marching band students have been practicing on and off throughout the summer.

I may be looking forward to this new school year more than any other in my 13 years of teaching. I will have four HS band classes in a row, a short break for prep time and lunch, then assist with two beginning band classes at the new Zionsville West Middle School. As much as I enjoyed teaching the technical theatre classes, I much prefer teaching bands. The HS bands will be Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, Concert Band, and Symphonic Band. The Marching Eagles is made up of the Wind Ensemble, the Symphonic Band, and all but 4 members of the Jazz Band. With the 14-member color guard, the Marching Eagles are totaling 132 students. The overall number of students in the band program is 178!

The outside-of-class-time staff for the Marching Eagles this year is strong. Jeff King, my full-time marching band assistant, will be in charge of the visual portion of our show. Julie Lakomek is returning as a second assistant and, as an experienced band director, is capable of assisting with any part of the marching band.

Kelly Wootan is the head color guard instructor and will be assisted by Kelly Kammerer. Our percussion section was under the instruction of Craig Brinkman through the summer and will be working with Travis Beck through the fall. Also on our staff through the summer was our former student teacher, Liz Leatherberry, who worked with the woodwinds, and Jordan Armstrong who worked with the low brass. Writing our music for us was Chris Tomsa. This was the first time in my tenure that we have had our music especially arranged for us. Daniel McCloud, who was our percussion instructor last season, wrote all the percussion music for our show this year. And, closing out our marching eagle staff is our drill writer, Chris Wing.

When our show, "Conestoga," is performed, there will be three life-size conestoga wagons moving across the field. Many thanks go out to Dave Danner, Mike Howenstein, Terry McCain, Chuck Riedl, Ron Chappell and others for the construction of the wagons. Also making a debut this season will be our new uniform racks. A big thank you to Joe Ping and students, Joey Heneghan and Tom Blackwell, and others

for building the racks!

While I'm in the thanking mode, Margaret Watson and Kathy Robertson have done a great job along with many other parents getting everyone fitted for a uniform.

We are ready for a great marching band season which will finish with our big trip to Disney World and the Bahamas! In case you haven't heard from the students, the trip will go on as scheduled. Thanks to all the additional chaperones that signed on to give us the preferred ratio of students to chaperones. By-the-way, the second regular trip payment of \$285 is due the first week of the school year. It's not like there are any other expenses to worry about, sorry. Be on the look out for fund raising opportunities to help with the cost of the trip.

All band students should be bringing a schedule home, but here are the upcoming events to know: Our home football games which the marching band will be attending are 8/19, 9/2, 9/9, and 10/7. Our Saturday competitions will begin the same day as the Fall Festival Parade on the following dates: 9/10, 9/17, 9/24, 10/1, 10/8, 10/15, and 10/22 if we make it to State Finals.

Thank you for everyone's continued support of the band program, and if you are new to the HS please plan to attend the ZBOP parent meetings and check out as many performances as you can.
